The data of this research were collected from various sources through browsing on internet and listening to the audio of the poetry to support the data analysis. In this research, the writer used descriptive qualitative method as a method of analysis. According to Omidvar (2016) Oppression is the access of the oppressed to venues and discourses of oppressors and the powerful, such skills have the fatal flaw of doing nothing-in the absence of oppressed groups from seats of power-to help oppressors, or those committing unjust acts, themselves have an inkling of the possibility that they oppress. Brook (2016) states that, oppression is a disease that has permeated all aspects of society since the beginning of time. It is responsible for the construction of the Egyptian empire and the development of North America through the oppression of slaves and the use of force to build these empires." In spite of Putra & Widyastuti (2014) "Oppression is somebody in a cruel and unfair way, especially by not giving them the same freedom, rights, et cetera. To make somebody only able to think sad or worrying things."In other words, oppression come from the majority class as a disease for minorities who can only think about sadness and do not get the same freedom or equal rights.

Maya Angelou's poetry is from a Marxist perspective where life poetry and tribal oppression or suppression is experienced by poets. Interpreting poetry is a series of one's heart which she can express through words. It is depending on how she expresses it, not with words of poetry, but all the forts come out of her heart and mind is poetry. No one can say that is wrong or true because it is her heart poem.

Methodology

This study uses descriptive qualitative method which describes the state of a status phenomenon that occurs with words or sentences. It is separated according to categories to make conclusions. It is also interpreted as a describing or portraying of the conditions in a community institution that are solved using scientific procedures.

The source of the data used in this research is Poetry By Maya Angelou entitled *The Complete Collected Poems of Maya Angelou*. It is published by Random House.
